The 2011 termination of the Army's 160 year military presence at the Fort Vancouver National Historic Site led to the hiring of Jones & Jones for planning and design services currently under way.

The renovated barracks building 987 will serve as a the new Gifford Pinchot National Forest Headquarters. Our design work will preserve and upgrade a significant historic structure while integrating new, highperformance building systems within both buildings. These buildings will function within a reconfigured access network that honors this historic "Crossroads of the Pacific Northwest" and integrates it within the larger cultural setting of the National Historic Site.
