The 120-mile Mountains to Sound Greenway courses from the shores of Puget Sound, across Lake Washington and over the Cascade Mountains to the ponderosa forests and prairies of eastern Washington.

This broad green corridor connects state parks, national forest areas, wilderness areas, the Cedar River Watershed, privately owned timber land and municipalities—preserving multi-purpose scenic, working and recreational landscapes for future generations.

Jones & Jones's contributions include heritage interpretation, forest management models, environmental education centers and interpretive signage.
