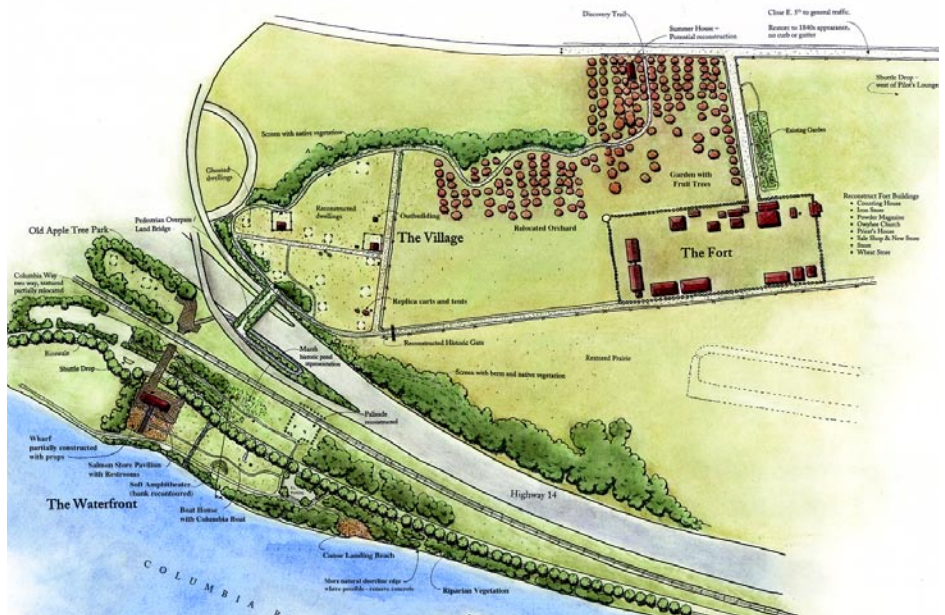

Fort Vancouver National Historic Site is a significant cultural landscape on the Columbia River in the Portland-Vancouver metropolitan area. Jones & Jones collaborated with the National Park Service to develop a General Management Plan (GMP) and a Master Plan for this national historic site.

The GMP establishes the vision for how the fort will be managed over two decades. The master plan outlines transportation and pedestrian circulation options, landscape treatments, and new park and visitor facilities.

We facilitated public workshops and collaborated with City of Vancouver and National Park staff to develop the plan.

Our work on this historic landscape deepened an understanding of Vancouver's historic, social, and ecological context, which we have subsequently applied to the Vancouver shoreline and City of Vancouver projects.
