Our master plan for this park in a newly annexed section of Port Orchard blends nature, community and art.

Woodlands and wetlands are the prevailing element of the 27 acres of designated parkland. Therefore the central focus is to protect the wetland/forest ecosystem while allowing people to interact with and understand its natural history and character. Large portions of forest and significant trees will be preserved and all development, with the exception of boardwalks, will occur outside of the wetland buffer. Nature trails, interpretive signs, meadows and fitness stations along a one-mile loop trail will provide opportunities to experience the workings of nature, as well as to exercise outdoors.

The park will also support community functions and local arts. Two main gathering areas—a Commons and an amphitheater—will provide places for informal activities, events and performances. Public art will also be integrated throughout the park.

This plan and design guidelines will guide the development of a robust park over the coming decade.
